

MASONIC TEMPLE CORNERSTONE LAID

Cleveland Heights Building to
Contain Banquet, Ball, Lodge
and Club Rooms.

The cornerstone of the new \$100,000 Cleveland Heights Masonic temple, at Mayfield and Lee rds., was laid yesterday afternoon. John Pinard, an officer of the Grand Lodge of Ohio, officiated in the place of F. H. Marquis, grand master of Ohio.

Short addresses to one hundred Masons who attended were made by Pinard and Mathew Smith, acting grand marshal. The temple will be the home of Heights Lodge, U. D., F. & A. M., a new lodge.

The building will contain banquet, ball, lodge and club rooms and while it is primarily for the use of the lodge, it will also be subject to the use of all organizations.

The building is being erected by the Heights Masonic Temple Building Company, the stock of which is controlled by members of the lodge. The new lodge now has 107 members. Dr. W. M. Bogue is master and A. B. Breitweg, secretary.
