- December 1954 .....Woodward Lodge appoints "Pre-planning Committee"
- October 1955 .....Woodward Lodge's "Pre-planning Committee" reports - insofar as Woodward Lodge is concerned - "A MOVE IS A MUST!"
- December 1955.....Woodward Lodge appoints a "Location Committee"
- January 1957 .....Woodward Masonic Temple Co. sets up "Lyndhurst Temple Committee"
- May 1957 .....Property at 3516 Mayfield Road purchased. Architect selected - plans started.
- March 1958 .....Stock goes on sale.
- June 1960 .....Woodward Temple sold.
- October 1960 .....Woodward Temple vacated.
- October 23, 1960...Ground Breaking Ceremonies.
- February 1, 1961...Actual construction started.
- May 14, 1961 .....Cornerstone Laying Ceremonies.
- October 14, 1961...First meeting in Temple - Installation of Officers of Order of Rainbow for Girls.
- May 10, 1962 .....Dedication Ceremonies.
